

Notes and Answer Key - FREE SAMPLE

Teaching ideas: Use as a warm up activity or for a fun practice opportunity any time. Divide the class into two groups or more so that there are at least two different puzzles being worked on throughout the room. Students can work individually, in pairs or in small groups, and then when they have guessed the four homonym pairs, they unscramble the circled letters from each column to reveal a fifth pair of homonyms. Students/teams then write their own clues to the fifth pair for another student/team to solve.

Each section of the worksheet is identified by a letter, so be sure to distribute the second part to students with a different letter.
