unwind	relax and stop feeling stressed (ex: unwind after a long day at work)
come out	be released or made available to the public (ex. podcast episode, movie, new album)
hack	a simple tip or trick to make something easier
cognitive shuffling	a sleep technique where you think of random words starting with each letter of a chosen word to distract your mind
shuffle	mix or move things around, often in a random order (ex. shuffling playing cards)
drift off	slowly fall asleep
every once in a while	used very commonly in conversation instead of "occasionally"
power goes out	the way to express the situation when electricity stops working suddenly and unexpectedly, such as from a storm (ex: our power went out during the storm)
pass [something] up	decide not to take advantage of an opportunity (ex: I wouldn't pass up the chance to take a nap.)
pass out	suddenly become unconscious or faint, usually from heat, fear, or lack of air.
run out of [something]	use all of something so that there is none left (ex. run out of oxygen in the crowded elevator)
sketchy	unsafe, scary, or suspicious
confined	in a small or closed space with little room to move
grate	a metal covering with holes (describing the kind used on old elevators)
shoot	a soft expression of frustration or surprise
RV	A large vehicle that has space for living, like a small home you can drive. It usually includes a bed, bathroom, and kitchen. (Short for "recreational vehicle.")
right up [one's] alley	Exactly the kind of thing someone likes or is good at (ex. it's right up my alley because I like retro and vintage things)
a no brainer	a very easy or obvious choice
snuggles	warm, close hugs or cuddles
	to waste or use time or a chance, often in a way that is not ideal
